Sharing Our Learning

In response to feedback from parents, we have been working to improve the ways in which we share our learning. As previously mentioned, our updated long-term plans (MYP) and two-year plans (DP) have been updated on our Secondary Website. Additionally, you can find there the Curriculum Handbooks, which go into more detail about each subject area. Finally, our teachers are working to ensure consistency across the school with our Unit Overviews on ManageBac. Parents have access to these Unit Overviews and can learn more about the specific unit of inquiry that their child is studying. For upcoming units, these will be completed at least one week prior to the commencement of the unit. We will email an infographic that can support you in accessing these Unit Overviews.

Conscious Counselling Tips (CCTs): Trying to raise kind and confident kids

5 specific questions to ask your child after school:

Did you understand everything you were taught today?

Some kids struggle to ask for help, and this can affect their performance. If your child did not understand something. Follow up on whether they asked for help and 'frame seeking help as a good thing'.

Is there anyone in your class(es) that is different?

If they say no, cool! If they say yes, you want to understand what your child sees as **different**. You also want to have a conversation around what makes them different to your child. The point here, is to use this conversation to promote kindness and inclusion.

How did you spend your time at break(s)?

This can give insight into the way your child likes to play socialise, who their friends are, and if they had any struggles. The more interested your child feels you are in their friends, the more eager they are to share > And the more they share, the more you can help them navigate social interactions.

Were you unkind to anyone?

Ask the question in a calm and non-judgmental way. Kids will conveniently omit information about them being unkind. This explicit question might lead to answers that can help you guide them. Also, when they know that this question is of interest to you, it can influence behaviour so they can truthfully answer "no".

Was anyone unkind to you?

Many kids find themselves processing feelings on their own, which can be detrimental. A problem shared is a problem halved. When your child is able to talk to you about even the micro moments that bothered them, they could feel less burdened. You can encourage them to **confidently** speak up, help them see things differently or talk to them about how to handle it.

Thought for the Week:

As we near Spring Break, I invite our school community to consider the possibility of embracing the values and compassion of giving during Ramadan. During the break, I encourage our MYP and DP students and families to engage in acts of kindness or volunteer work. It's a chance to make a difference in the lives of others and deepen our sense of community. These can be small acts or grand gestures

Let's use this time not just for rest, but to spread positivity and support around us. Your stories of kindness are incredibly valuable and I eagerly await hearing about the ways you chose to contribute. Let's share these experiences to inspire our school community and demonstrate the impact of our collective actions.

Reflecting on Progress and Support

Three-way conferences provided a wonderful opportunity for Steven, Jay, the entire team, and me to engage with students and families, reflecting on all the work and progress made throughout the school year so far. We were overwhelmed by the positive feedback regarding the support students are receiving.

One of the common areas the students, parents, and team all noticed was the remarkable growth in confidence and self-advocacy among our students. Their increasing comfort in seeking and receiving support both within and outside the classroom is evident, and an important step towards being effective advocates of their own needs.

Parents have demonstrated a real openness in seeking advice and support, implementing strategies and structures at home to support wellbeing and academic progress. They have also highlighted the noticeable changes in classroom support provided by teachers.

Transitioning from the Primary Years Programme (PYP) to the Middle Years Programme (MYP) presented its challenges, but parents were thankful for the support during that transition facilitated by the inclusion team, providing students with a smooth landing into secondary school.
