

#### **School Calendar**

There have been inquiries about the school calendar, specifically the Spring Break being 3 weeks and occurring during the Holy Month of Ramadan. Please note that Spring Break is not determined at a school level, rather by ADEK for all schools in Abu Dhabi. ADEK has constraints on the school calendar and selects the Winter Break and Spring Break dates.

### **ECPs**

We are excited to kick off both our internal and external ECPs. There has been a great response from students, and we are pleased to be able to offer a wide range of activities. After receiving feedback from parents last year, we scheduled the ECPs for the entire year to ensure consistency in offering a wide range of activities throughout the school year. Please understand that it is a very complex process in scheduling the ECPs in terms of the day of the week and the timing. We are working around the schedules of our staff, external staff and companies, availability of limited facilities, school meetings, and more. Our team has worked very hard to minimize overlap, but it is inevitable that there will be overlap for some clubs.

#### AIM

Students in Grades 11-12 have a new and exciting opportunity to engage with an academic supervisor through our Academic Intervention Model. Students will meet with their supervisor on a termly basis to discuss their progress, time-management, goals, university plans, and more. Grade 12s met with their supervisors on 14 September, and Grade 11 students will meet with their supervisors in the following weeks.

### **Supporting Your Child**

Please remember that one of our priorities at Raha International School is to support and foster student agency, self-reliance, and independence. Parents can join us in these efforts by supporting their child/children in resolving their concerns independently. If your child shares a concern with you, rather than seeking out the school, provide your child with an opportunity to practice independence by discussing the concern with you and providing you with their plan to resolution. Parents can guide their children by asking "Have you considered \_\_\_\_?" Together, you and your child can come up with an effective plan. However, if your child is not able to resolve the concern or you feel the concern is of a greater magnitude, you should also contact the appropriate individuals at the school. Together, we can support our secondary students in living out the Learner Profile Attributes!
